Wednesday Community Outreach

On Wednesday, March 3, a highlight of our outreach was engaging specialists from Wisconsin Veterans Affairs. Gerald Sieren (Marine Corps Veteran) who supervises Veterans Outreach & Recovery Program (VORP) and Adayta Axelson, AODA specialist with a strong background in criminal justice, accompanied Karen Andro our remote outreach



team leader, and Hope's Home Ministries volunteer Ronnie Barbette (Marine Corps Veteran & Advocate for Homeless Rights). Ronnie experienced chronic homelessness in his past using his experience to help transform the lives of others, and serve as a leader in our community including serving on the City and County Homeless Issues Committee (HIC) where he helped our community give voice to the rights of individuals and families who experience homelessness.

Karen and Ronnie built a bridge to care and housing by bringing Gerald and Adayta to a remote outreach site to meet with Danette and Steve. Here in the parking lot of a neighborhood park, they met and shared deeply personal conversation with two veterans suffering trauma and homelessness. This relationship took many month to cultivate sharing basic survival needs; food, supplies, survival gear, and during subzero weather hotel respite.

Thanks to hotel respite, and prior to that being able to help with nutritious food, supplies, and survival gear--A bridge was built. This was the first of 21 individual connections made by Karen and Ronnie on Wednesday.

We are grateful for the support of donors and the engagement of volunteers who procure food, stock and organize our inventory of food and supplies, bake Loaves of Love, prepare hot meals, assemble emergency food bags, cleanup kits, make special Blessing Bags and share spiritual messages of Hope.

Gift of Transportation

One of the most critical unmet needs for individuals and families experiencing homelessness is transportation: bus passes, gas cards and cab rides.

Friends of the State Street Family helps with bus passes along with other homeless service providers. We have a very limited budget to help with taxi transportation vital in responding to immediate needs. We do not transport individuals in our own vehicles, and we call 9-1-1 for situations involving imminent danger.

Most of our interactions requiring transportation assistance are getting individuals and families to day or night



shelter, jobs, a place where individuals and families may spend some time "doubled-up" at a friend or family's rental unit often placing that household at risk of losing their lease. A vehicle can serve as safe shelter, warmth and solitude away from congregant day and overnight shelters.

Many individuals sleep in their vehicles such as Danette who is a veteran pictured here with her service dog Frank. Several sleep in their vehicles in a parking lot near their place of employment not able to afford gas to get to and from shelters.
